	Information entered into the register is accessible for the staff by logging into the Justus service with valid domain names. Accepted publications can also be seen in the open access Research.fi service.  The right to rectification The data subject has the right to demand rectification of inaccurate personal data concerning them. (Article 16)  Requests to correct errors should be sent to the registry's contact person, who will acknowledge when the error has been corrected.





	The right to erasure With certain restrictions specified in the General Data Protection Regulation, the data subject has the right to have the controller erase the personal data concerning him or her. (Article 17)
	The right to restriction of processing With certain exceptions specified in the General Data Protection Regulation the data sub- ject has the right to request the controller to restrict the processing of personal data con- cerning him or her. (Article 18)
